

Results back: Mid-December

PSAT Scores explanation: 12/18 X-block

DECEMBER

- Using PSAT/NMSQT results and materials begin to develop range of colleges
- Talk with graduates who are home from college
- Meet with your counselor to discuss PSAT and plan on which test to take (or go testoptional)
- Attend Junior Assembly w/ Lenny (12/12, advisory)

JANUARY

- Junior Seminars (Dec 16 thru Feb 6)
- Begin College Process with your counselor
- Being college search using Naviance
- Attend Gap Year Fair (1/13, 6 pm)

FEBRUARY

- Attend Junior Night (2/12, 6:30 pm, parents & students)
- Research interesting summer courses, jobs (Kate Cordner), or activities
- Junior Seminars continue

MARCH

- Attend Junior Guidance Seminars (MCAS week)
- Attend BHS College Fair (3/19, 6 pm)
- Plan challenging but balanced senior year
- Consider taking SAT Subject tests in courses you are finishing this year

APRIL

MAY

JUNE

- Take SAT
- Continue college search

- Review scores & plan if you need to take tests again in the Fall

SUMMER

- Continue to work on college list
- Continue extracurricular and community service activities
- Earn money for college
- Start thinking about college essays
- Consider filling out Common App
